

EuroBiO Career Fair Open Day

Wednesday 8th October 2008

EuroBiO Career Fair Open Day aims to generate optimum market conditions for recruiters and job seekers. It's aimed at recruiters, job seekers and higher education establishments and seeks to further the mobility of researchers throughout the European Research Area. This year the Career Fair Open Day has teamed with London Biotechnology Network, ScienceCareers and Association Bernard Gregory.

What is Career Fair Open Day?

The Career Fair Open Day draws its inspiration from BIO's highly successful Career Fair: inside the Salle Maillot (next to the EuroBiO exhibition in the Hall Maillot) candidates with the minimum of a Masters Degree in Sciences, or final year PhD, queue up in front of recruiting companies' desks to introduce themselves and their career plans, rather than for "in-depth" interviews that often lack privacy. HR personnel are encouraged to quit the comfort zone of their side of the desk to mingle with and meet candidates in the queue on the "public" side.

- Conviviality sets candidates at ease by eliminating the barrier of the table
- Increased throughput increases the chances of pinpointing exceptional profiles.

During the latter part of the day, recruiters can offer these exceptional profiles "in-depth" interviews in the privacy of partnering cubicles that will be made available in EuroBiOpartnering.

Career Fair Seminars

The Career Fair Open Day seminars will be looking at alternative science careers (to the laboratory) and the multiple talents that biotechnology companies require to grow their businesses. The seminars will cover journalism in science, degrees for managing biotechnology companies, how to make the most of doctoral education and concrete measures that facilitate the mobility of researchers.
